

Rush Center,
Dec. 1st 1874.

To His Excellency, J. A. Os-
born, Topeka, Kansas.

At a Meeting of the Citizens
of Rush County held at Rush
Center Dec. 1st 1874, to consider
the Organization of said County
the following Resolutions were
unanimously adopted:

Whereas, A Report duly made
out setting forth the fact that Rush
County has a population of over two
[Six Hundred] inhabitants having
been forwarded under all the for-
malities of the Law to the Governor;
and

Whereas, The requisite popu-
lation being conceded by all our

Citizens, and no objection that
we are aware existing against organ-
ization at the present time; and all
believing that the highest interests
of the County, the welfare of each
and every Citizen would be fur-
thered by Immediate Organ-
ization, therefore

Resolved, That in view of
the needy condition of many of our
Citizens, and the necessity of our
County devising means for their
relief independent of any ad-
sistance that may be otherwise ex-
pected, Organization at once, and
immediates would be the highest
good that could be secured.

Resolved, That a copy of these
proceedings be forwarded to His Ex-
cellency, begging his Earliest attention
to the Report and prayer for Organization.
